A couple from Dallas, Texas, read the article in last week's Estes Park Trail, and drove to Glen Haven to contribute a first aid kit and generous sum of money. 29 December 1967 – Column title and byline: Glen Haven Events by Diann Admire. A new year is almost here, which means that it's time to look back at the happenings of 1967, a year that has passed so quickly...It was on Sunday, 1 January 1967, that Mr. Jerry Batchelor of Wichita, Kansas, and Mr. and Mrs. Joe Shaffer held the grand opening of the Glencrofter Country Store...In May 1967, after a letter to and a meeting between Governor Love and Dottie Ferguson, state officials removed gas tanks from the ground. It was a large group that gathered that cold day in May 1967 to see if there was leaking gas coming from these underground storage tanks. Any visitor to Glen Haven on this day would surely have thought a convention was in progress...June 1967 brought the summer residents from all over the United States to their Glen Haven cottages. The shops welcomed tourists and friends for another season, and Cheley Camp began another year of summer activities for girls and boys from all parts of the country. Another Glencrofter enterprise, the Horseshoe Café, opened its doors for business during the month of June 1967...The Glen Haven Association held its annual meeting on Saturday, 29 July 1967. Members were brought up to date on the activities of the association, and Robert Turner of Greleey, Clarence Nold of Glen Haven, and Dudley Bentley of Wheatridge were elected to the board...The Glen Haven Story, written by our well-known neighbor and long-time resident Dr. Joseph G. Knapp, was published this past summer. The book is a welcome addition to the store of historical literature in the Estes Park region. Its 80 pages brought back many memories to pioneer residents of Glen Haven, and is in truth "a microcosm of the unfolding west"...The summer months were filled with an unusual amount of rainfall. This caused complaints from the hikers, horseback riders, and shop keepers, but the hillsides were truly a rainbow of colors...Luck was once again with the residents of Glen Haven, that September 1967 evening, when fire

completely destroyed the Dan Weitzel cabin on North Fork. The realization that the community had been fortunate, but the need for a better knowledge of fire fighting and preparedness, convinced year round residents to join together to form a more effective and better equipped fire department...The newly organized "Fire Belles" raised over a thousand dollars through "fire hose" donations and a benefit dance held on 7 October 1967 at the Red Stallion. To this date, over \$1400 has been raised, 400 feet of fire hose has been purchased, and residents are just beginning to make the Glen Haven fire department the organization it should be...1967 has brought changes to our picturesque community. The post office was enlarged and the Glen Haven Lodge became the Inn of Glen Haven. We've said goodbye to friends and pioneer residents through moves and through death, but hellos to many, who have decided to make Glen Haven their home, either on a year round or weekend basis. Fellowship and good times have taken place through a common cause. Thus the year-end inventory has been taken, and 1968 can be the best year yet.
